

**University of Cincinnati Clermont College  
Alumni Survey - 2002-2005**

**Introduction**

During the 2004-05 academic year, the Graduating Student Survey was reviewed by the Ad Hoc Student Outcomes and General Education Committees. The survey instrument was revised based on input from the committee members and the campus community. Selected items used with permission of University of Washington Office of Educational Assessment. A companion Alumni Survey was developed to complement the Graduating Student Survey in an effort to gather data on graduates 1-3 years after program completion. Results of the inaugural administration of the Alumni Survey are presented in this report.

**Methodology**

The survey was mailed to 1,038 alumni who completed programs from 2002 to 2005. The mailing addresses were obtained from the University Alumni Office. The first mailing was sent in mid November 2005 and included a postcard identifying the alumni with a passcode assigned by the Alumni Office database. Alumni were asked to return the passcode postcard along with the survey in order to be eligible for prize drawings. 28 (24%) alumni did not return the passcode postcard with the completed survey. An online survey was made available on the UC Clermont College website to enable alumni to respond to the survey online or by mail. A follow-up postcard was mailed to non-respondents in late December. 41 surveys (4%) were undeliverable to the provided address. One hundred sixteen (116) alumni returned the survey for an overall response rate of 11.2%. 11 (9.5% of the completed surveys) surveys were completed online.

**Respondent and Graduating Class Demographics**

The extent to which respondents are representative of the overall alumni population determines whether findings may be generalized. Comparing the demographics of survey respondents with those of the 2002-05 alumni shows that respondents are not representative of alumni in many areas.

### **Limitations**

Survey results represent the opinions and experiences of approximately one-tenth of the program completers during the three year period between 2002-2005. *Findings should be generalized with caution and reported only with reference to the surveyed population.* Note, also, that as data are disaggregated, the number of students included in analyses becomes smaller and generalization becomes more problematic. Unless otherwise noted, non-respondents to individual items (and the percentage of students they represent) are included in analyses, but are not reported in tables. Therefore, percentages may not add up to 100.

## The UC Clermont College Experience

### Satisfaction with Services and Education

The Alumni Survey contains several items asking alumni to indicate their level of satisfaction with the quality of UCCC's services and their overall education. Overall, the majority of alumni were "very" or "mostly" satisfied with the quality of college services. Alumni were most satisfied with admissions, computer labs and registration. Alumni were least satisfied with academic advising, Cougar Cafe, and the bookstore. Alumni reported the co-op program, disability services, student activities and the student resource center were the services they used least.

## **Summary**

---

The results of the UC Clermont College Alumni Survey 2002-2005 show that alumni reported a high level of satisfaction with college services and their educational experience. 78% of responding alumni indicate advanced education at the baccalaureate level or higher as a long-term educational goal and 79% are satisfied with their readiness for advanced education. 86% of the alumni were employed, 53% full-time, while attending UC Clermont College and 86% are currently employed. 67% of alumni reported UC Clermont College as their first choice college, 84% would choose to attend UCCC over again, and 95% would recommend UCCC to others.
