



## Liberal Arts

### ■ What Is Liberal Arts?

Liberal arts is the college curriculum which teaches general knowledge and develops intellectual capacities. Studies include languages, literature, history, philosophy, mathematics and science. Liberal arts is the foundation of many professional educations and executive careers because it provides a broad cultural education and develops critical thinking skills.

This program provides you with the first 2 years toward completion of a bachelor's degree in liberal arts.

### ■ Success Factors

Liberal arts is a very broad field of study that can accommodate people of widely varied aptitudes and interests. It may be especially suited for you if you have many interests and high curiosity about the world around you, or if you do not want to confine your studies to a single discipline.

### ■ Career Possibilities

A liberal arts major is not limited to one specific vocation. Its aim is to teach you to think critically, analytically and creatively. It educates you in clear, coherent communication skills, both oral and written. It broadens your understanding and enhances your ethical decision-making. It prepares you to learn vocational or technical skills easily and quickly. It is the foundation on which executive careers are built.

A liberal arts background is quite useful if you are pursuing a career in law, medicine, marketing, advertising, insurance, editing and publishing, journalism, sales, teaching or any of the increasingly complex technological industries that demand well-educated professionals.

### ■ Majoring In Liberal Arts

This program provides the first 2 years of study for a baccalaureate degree.

In liberal arts, you will take a wide variety of courses in the humanities and the social and natural sciences. You may choose electives to meet your particular needs.

You should take liberal arts if you plan a bachelor's degree in any of the following fields:

Classical Civilization	Philosophy
Economics	Political Science
English	Psychology
Fine Arts	Sociology
Foreign Languages	Theatre Arts

You should be able to complete this program in 2 years, attending full-time fall, winter and spring quarters. You will need another 2 years of full-time study to complete your bachelor's degree.



## ■ Program Requirements

You should check with your academic advisor every quarter *before* you register for classes. Two years is really a short time to squeeze in all of your degree requirements. We cannot offer every course every quarter. If you miss taking a prerequisite for a required course, or don't take a particular course the only quarter it is offered during the year, you can jeopardize your ability to complete your degree on time.
