

Complete your 2021–2022 FAFSA at **studentaid.gov.** Make sure you include the University of Cincinnati. Our **school code is 003125.** Need help with completing your FAFSA? **Contact the One Stop Student Services Center** at 513-556-1000, or via Webex and Starfish between 10 a.m.-3 p.m. Monday–Friday. Complete your FAFSA as soon as possible after Oct. 1 for maximum award eligibility.

A new FAFSA must be completed <u>each year</u> for the academic year beginning in August.



# **UC Clermont Technology Services**

- Wireless Internet Access The University of Cincinnati provides an extensive wireless network. The college currently utilizes the WPA2-Enterprise security standard. To access the wireless system, log into the "UC\_Secure" network using your UC Credentials.
- **Computer Labs** UC Clermont College has approximately 275 academic computers. This includes our instructional labs as well as the Library. The Library computers are available for all registered Clermont students. Hours are posted online at **ucclermont.edu/about/ technology-services.**
- **Printing** At the beginning of every semester, all enrolled UC Clermont students will receive \$10.50 of subsidized printing (150 free prints) added to their Bearcat ID Card. When this amount has been spent, you can add money to your UC Bearcat Card to use for printing.

- **Email/Office 365** Microsoft Office 365 is the official student email platform, but it is a lot more than just an email. Students have access to Microsoft Office tools, including:
  - A free download of the Microsoft Office Suite on up to 5 devices, including smartphones.
  - Centrally managed email and calendars powered by Microsoft Exchange, easily accessible from mobile devices.
  - Instant messaging and web conferencing with Microsoft Lync, including online meetings and desktop sharing.
  - Microsoft Office Web Apps that allow you to create and edit Microsoft documents using your favorite web browser.
  - Up to 1 TB of cloud-based storage with OneDrive so you can store, organize and share your important documents in the cloud.
- Anti-virus Software McAfee anti-virus suite and anti-spyware for home and personal use can be downloaded by UC students, faculty and staff at no cost.
- **OneDrive Cloud Storage** OneDrive is UC's supported cloud-based file storage platform designed to enable users to securely store, share, manage, and access files online anytime, anywhere, from any device. All students, faculty and staff have access to OneDrive. Users get 1 TB of data storage.

# **UC Clermont College Terms**

#### Academic Plan/Major

The program of study a student has chosen (example: Biological Sciences).

### **Academic Advisor**

A staff or faculty member who assists students with planning their curriculum, selecting courses and staying on track to reach their goals.

### Associate Degree

A degree awarded upon completion of a program of study traditionally completed in two years with full-time enrollment (60-credit-hour minimum).

### Canvas

UC's Learning Management System that connects you to your courses. Stay in the loop with Announcements, track due dates with the active Calendar, check grades, review instructor feedback and communicate directly with teachers and classmates.

# Catalyst

UC's online student portal where students can search for classes, add/drop classes, view class schedules, check final grades, monitor progress against a degree plan, view account balances & pay bills, manage financial aid and much more. For terms specific to Catalyst, visit **onestop.uc.edu/other/self-help.** 

# Certificate

A non-degree option for students who want to enter the job market following the completion of the academic course of study.

# **Co-requisite**

Co-requisites are courses that must be taken at the same time.

### **Credit hour**

The number of hours each course is worth. Each major requires a certain number of hours for graduation.

### **Degree Audit/Academic Requirements**

A computer-generated analysis that lists all of the requirements for a degree. The degree audit will note if a requirement has or has not been fulfilled, or if it is in progress. This is a useful tool to track progress toward degree completion.

# FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

The application students complete to apply for financial aid to assist with college bills.

# Grade Point Average (GPA)

At the end of each semester, your GPA will be determined for the semester. Additionally, all semester GPAs are combined to make a "University GPA." To be in good academic standing and/or graduate a student must have a University GPA of 2.0 or higher.

### Prerequisite

Prerequisites are courses that must be taken before another course.

### Probation

Academic probation is a warning that a student's performance falls below the UC's requirement for "good academic standing."

# Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

A standard used to measure a student's successful completion of coursework toward a degree in order to maintain eligibility for student financial aid.

#### Semester

Approximately 16 weeks of instruction offered two times a year during the fall and spring. Summer semester has varied options and weeks of instruction.

### Syllabus

A document created by instructors and given to students detailing each course's objectives, goals, contact information and areas of study for a semester.

### Transcript

A list of all courses taken at the University showing the earned grade for each course.

### Transfer

Going from one college to another.

### Transition

Going from UC Clermont to another UC college.

# **FERPA and the Student's Right to Review Records**

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (34 C.F.R. Part 99 — commonly known as FERPA), is the federal law that governs the release of and access to student education records. FERPA affords students certain rights with respect to their education records. These rights include:

**The right to inspect and review** your education records within forty-five (45) days of the day the University receives a request for access. Students should submit to the registrar, dean, head of the academic department, or other appropriate official, a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The University official will make arrangements for access and will notify the student of the time and place where the records may be inspected. If the records are not maintained by the University official to whom the request was submitted, that official shall advise the student of the correct official to whom the request should be addressed. Copies of any portion of the record will be provided at a cost currently established at ten cents (\$0.10) per page, excluding the official transcript of the student's permanent academic record for which the University's transcript policy and fee will apply.

**The right to request an amendment** of the student's education record if the student believes it is inaccurate or misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA. A student who wishes to ask the University to amend a record should submit a written request to the University office responsible for the record, clearly identifying the part of the record the student wants changed and specifying why it should be changed. That office will notify the student of its decision. Contact the Office of the Ombuds at 513-556-5956 should you encounter difficulty in obtaining the requested record review. If the University office decides not to amend the record as requested, the student may request a hearing before the University's Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act Committee. To request this hearing, contact the Office of the Registrar.

The right to provide written consent before the University discloses personally identifiable information from the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with "legitimate educational interest." A school official is an employee, agent or other person acting on behalf of the University, to include: a person employed by the University in an administrative, supervisory, academic or research, or support staff position (including law enforcement unit personnel and health staff); a person or company with whom the University has contracted as its agent to provide a service instead of using University employees or officials (such as an attorney, auditor, collection agent, or enrollment/degree certification service facilitator); a person serving on the Board of Trustees; or a student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibilities for the University.

Upon request, the University also may disclose education records without consent to officials of another school in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

**FERPA affords students the right to file a complaint** with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the University to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA is:

#### **Directory Information**

At its discretion, University of Cincinnati may provide "directory information" in accordance with FERPA provisions. Directory information is defined as that information which would not generally be considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed. Designated directory information at University of Cincinnati includes the following:

**Category I:** student's name, dates of attendance, enrollment status, degrees conferred and dates, honors and awards, college, class, and major field of study

Category II: student identifier (non-Social Security Number), address, e-mail address, and telephone number

**Students may block the public disclosure of directory information** (all or by category) by completing an online "Directory Information Hold-Release Authorization Form".

#### Please consider carefully the consequences of a decision to withhold directory information.

University of Cincinnati will honor requests for the non-disclosure of directory information until the student rescinds the request in writing (or by the form) to the UC Registrar's Office.
